

Emory Clinic – School of Medicine Faculty

Physicians with an Emory Clinic affiliation hold faculty appointments in Emory University School of Medicine. As faculty members, Emory Clinic physicians have three missions: provide service to our patients, teach the next generation of health care professionals and conduct research to help develop new and better ways to prevent and treat disease.

Emory Clinic physicians are also part of the Emory Physician Group Practice and participate in the Emory Healthcare Network.

Emory Physician Group Practice

Physicians with this affiliation are employed by Emory Healthcare and practice at one of our 11 hospitals and/or 250 locations.

This affiliation includes Emory Clinic physicians. Emory Physician Group Practice physicians are members of the Emory Healthcare Network.

Emory Healthcare Network

Emory Healthcare Network is comprised of Emory Clinic, Emory Physician Group Practice and private practice physicians to create a single comprehensive care management system.

The Emory Healthcare Network creates levels of accountability through a common set of quality measures and goals to benefit patients and their families.

Winship Cancer Institute of Emory University

Winship Cancer Institute of Emory University is open to any faculty member of Emory University, with a predominant interest in cancer or a cancer related discipline and who meets the stated requirements for membership.

Federal regulations require that as a National Cancer Institute (NCI) designated Cancer Center, the Winship Cancer Institute must have a formal membership application process, which is audited by the NCI.

Physicians with No Listed Affiliations

Physicians that hold credentials to practice at Emory Healthcare hospitals but are not faculty members at Emory University School of Medicine, not employed by Emory Healthcare and are not members of the Emory Healthcare Network.
